Emergency drills

Every year schools are required to review and update their emergency procedures. This week and next Alfords Point Public School will be conducting emergency drills as part of our yearly review. This will involve the school conducting a lockdown and evacuation drill. If you are at the school assisting during our drills, please follow the instructions provided by the teachers.

Bush Fire procedures

Today I attended a briefing from NSW Rural fire Services. The bushfire season has been brought forward due to the dry weather. Alfords Point Public School Bushfire Procedures are well and truly in place and will be reviewed regularly over the summer period. It is important that everyone is aware of our procedures. It is only in the event of a catastrophic fire danger rating that the school will temporarily cease operations for the day(s). The school receives a notification of this at approximately 4.30pm on the day before and we will be in contact with you via email or "Skoolbag" on such occasions.

The Rural Fire Service website: www.rfs.nsw.gov.au is a source of important information and is a good website to have bookmarked.

As a suburb surrounded by bush it is important to regularly review Bushfire Plans so as to be prepared in an emergency. I encourage all families to review their procedures.

The children had an opportunity to work in the classroom and experience big school whilst the parents/carers attended an information session in the hall. School Crossing Supervisors – Work with your community Permanent Part-Time position – Alfords Point Public School – 00006G52

An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely. The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwile back to the community.

The position is working 22.5 hours per fortnight within the hours of 8:15 am - 09:30 am and 2:30 pm - 3:30 pm Monday to Friday during school terms. The base rate is \$23.02 - \$27.62 per hour.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children Check clearance.
