Lost Student Property

Tell Them From Me student survey – year 4-6

This term our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. You may remember that our Year 4-6 students also participated in a Tell Them From Me student survey in term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year. The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the Tell Them From Me survey to help improve how they do things at school.

The survey is confidential, conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between Monday 26 August and Friday 25 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. A consent form is being sent home with students from Year 4-6 and FAQs for parents /carers is available via the above link. If you do not want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by Friday 16 August.

Partners in Learning

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's exprience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, ipads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 26 August and 25 October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

Life Education – Healthy Harold

A brief outline of the range of programs that will be seen by the children is listed below:

KD & KJ Harold's Friendships: Explores how to build friendships and care for others, feelings and emotions, safe and unsafe situations and early warning signs, safe places and people to turn to for help.

1/2L, 1/2M & 1/2PK *Growing Good Friends:* Unsafe behaviours, situations and environments, healthy food choices.

3/4T & 3/4R *Mind Your Medicine:* Safe and unsafe situations, medicines and consequence of misuse, peer influence and friendship, positive communication.

4/5M, 5/6D & 5/6L Relate Respect Connect: Students explore building positive, safe and respectful relationships.
