#### **Student Attendance**

A reminder to parents/carers that regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to maximise their potential. There are a number of students who are regularly arriving late each day. All students who are not in attendance at the morning assembly need to go to the office with an adult to get a late slip before going to class. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. Parents are required to explain the absences of their children from school promptly and within seven days to the school. A fact sheet is located in the newsletter today which highlights the impact absence from school can have over a child's school years.

#### **Emergency drills**

Every year schools are required to review and update their emergency procedures. Over the next three weeks Alfords Point Public School will be conducting emergency drills as part of our yearly review. This will involve the school conducting a lockdown and evacuation drill. If you are at the school assisting during our drills, please follow the instructions provided by the teachers.

#### **School Uniforms**

With the weather starting to get warmer as we move towards the end of term, students have a choice of whether to wear full summer uniform or stay in their winter uniform depending on weather. Please do not put tights with the summer uniform.

Students have been reminded that they need to wear their school hat at recess, lunch and during sport. Students without a hat will need to remain under the COLA during these times. The school does not provide spare hats or encourage students to share their hat with friends. Parents/carers are reminded that the school hat ratified by the P&C is the **BOLAR HAT not a cap**. School hats are available for purchase from the School Uniform shop or our office when needed. Thank you for your cooperation.
