SCHOOL BUS

After School Bus

Transdev operate an after school bus service from the bus stop outside the school to the top of Alfords Point Hill. If your child uses this service please notify the school, in writing, of the days he or she will be catching the bus.

All students using this service must tap on and off with a valid Opal card. Transdev will be conducting random visits to schools to reinforce the message of the need to tap on and off with a valid card.

Below is information regarding the eligibility for a School Opal card.

Students need to live a minimum distance from their school to be eligible for a School Opal card, as follows:

Years K-2 (Infants)

There's no minimum distance.

Years 3-6 (Primary)

1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking or further.

If you child is not eligible for a School Opal card then you will need to purchase a Child Opal card.

Swimming Carnival

Last Wednesday all students in Years 3 to 6 and six very tiny eight year old Year 2 students attended our annual swimming carnival at Revesby Swimming Pool. The weather was glorious and the opportunity to cool off in both pools was enjoyed by students. Many points were gained for each house by students who competed in individual events, house relays and novelty events. Bonus points were awarded for war cries. The sea of colour during Mexican waves was quite a pleasant spectacle for the supporters. The winning house was Yellow Cockatoos (708 pts), second was Green Lorikeets (678 pts), third Blue Kookaburras (654 pts) and fourth was Red Rosellas (630). I was very proud of the students as they demonstrated great sportsmanship and participated keenly in events. We are hoping to hand out ribbons to the final placegetters in each event at Monday 25 February's assembly at 9.10am whereby family and friends will be most welcome to attend. We will confirm the date of the swimming ribbons assembly as soon as possible.

The squad of students selected to represent our school at the Engadine Zone Carnival will be announced next week and those students will compete on Tuesday 5 March at Engadine Pool. Good luck to those swimmers. Again this year during the novelty events we promoted the non competitive safety stroke of 'Backscull'. Students participated in water drills giving them the opportunity to practice this stroke in shallow water and many students swam several laps of backscull in the 50m olympic pool. This was a fun way to get wet whilst providing the students with a survival strategy to use if the need arises. The students have also been reciting in assembly the chant '*Don't panic, roll on your back and float, think don't sink'* as a reminder of how to safely move in the water, should they get into difficulty. Participating in training sessions/lessons will increase the students' fitness levels and enable them to enjoy the water with confidence, ability and safety. It also enables the children to participate in many, many fun activities and the skills they develop will stay with them throughout their teenage and adult years. Why not even think about joining a swimming club at a nearby pool (Menai Swim Club operates out of Menai Swim Academy pool on Friday nights) or in the summer months a Nippers Club at the beach?

Our next carnival will be the annual Alfords Point Public School Cross Country Carnival on Friday 5 April at Coachwood Oval. Put this day in your diary as again family and friends are welcome. Trials for winter PSSA teams of soccer and netball will be held in the coming weeks. More information will be passed on next week as the first PSSA meeting was yesterday afternoon and we are presently in the process of organising our calendars.
