#### Principal's Message

#### Identified COVID-19 cases at school

We have a number of identified cases of COVID-19 at school at the moment.

Parents/Carers are reminded that students and staff cannot attend school if they are showing any <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u>. These include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection).

Please be vigilant and if your child is unwell, please do not send them to school. Please keep them at home.

#### **Building works**

I have been advised that in the coming weeks building works will be occurring at the school. The demountable building housing the canteen and before and after school care is being refurbished with new floor coverings as well as internal and external painting. Our canteen will also be upgraded during this time with new cupboards, benchtops and appliances. In addition to the demountable works the school is also set to have a new roof installed in the admin and classroom blocks.

The demountable building works are expected to begin on Monday 20 June 2022.

The canteen will be closed for the last two weeks of term (week 9 and 10). Parents/Carers will need to provide recess and lunch for their children everyday during this time as the canteen will be non-operational. Canteen stock will be reduced over the next two weeks in preparation for the refurbishment. Please be advise that this may affect what food items are available during this time when ordering online. Thank you for your understanding.

Jubilee Alfords Point Before and After school care will operate as usual; however, they will relocate to the hall during this time.

#### **Alfords Point Public School Award System**

We enjoy celebrating student learning, effort and success in a variety of ways. One way we do this is through our award system. At our weekly whole School assemblies, awards are given to students from each class who have demonstrated commitment to their learning and made positive contributions at school. These awards include a Student of the Week award and a number of merit awards for each class.

Our award system is accumulative from Kindergarten to Year 6 and we encourage families to keep student awards in a safe place. When your child has received enough awards to be eligible for the next level of award, send the awards into school in a plastic sleeve. These awards will be processed and returned to students before students receive their new award at the next Stage awards assembly. It is only the Student of the Week awards and the small merit awards (handprint or



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silver design) that are eligible for this system. The Learner Qualities (Turtle-y) awards presented at the end of the year are not a part of this system.

#### Award levels:

5 school awards (merit and/or Student of the Week awards) = 1 Achievement Award

2 Achievement Awards = 1 Banner

2 Banners = Bronze Medallion

1 Bronze Medallion and 1 Banner = Silver Medallion

1 Silver Medallion and 1 Banner = Gold Medallion
