Reports

2024 Semester 1 reports will be sent home on Thursday 4 July.

The reports follow the reporting procedures where reports have an A-E Scale. Your child, except for Kindergarten students and students with special learning needs will receive an A to E in all curriculum areas. This scale is explained on the front of each report.

Below is an explanation of the A to E scale.

<u>A-Outstanding</u> The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.

<u>B-High</u> The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.

<u>C-Sound</u> The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

<u>D-Basic</u> The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competences in the processes and skills.

<u>E-Limited</u> The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

NAIDOC Week

The official NAIDOC Week is held from 7 July to 14 July. The theme this year is 'Keep the fires burning!'. We will be acknowledging NAIDOC Week as a school next week, in Week 10, as we reflect and recognise the histories, cultures, and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

- Know where safe places are a shop, service station, Police station, library or school. If you are ever frightened, you should go to one of these places and ask them to call the Police
- Learn about safe adults you can look for and talk to if you need help Police officers, teachers at school, adults you know and trust
- Don't talk to people you don't know and never get into a car with someone you don't know. If a car stops on the side of the road and you don't know the person inside, do not stop
- If you are scared, call Triple Zero (OOO) and tell them you are scared
- Try to walk in pairs
- Try to walk on the side of the road opposite to the traffic i.e. with cars coming towards you
