Dear Parents/Carers.

As previously communicated Alfords Point Public School has postponed or cancelled all wider school community activities for Term 1 in line with NSW Department of Education advice. This is a proactive measure and predominantly means that we only have the students and teachers at school each day.

On Tuesday 24 March we will hold the cross country event for all students K-6. Students are to wear their coloured house sports uniform to school on Tuesday. If you do not have a coloured sports shirt please send your child to school in their normal sports uniform. We still have outstanding medication and permission notes for some students. Please ensure these are returned to school tomorrow Friday 20 March. As already advised and per Department guidelines parents/carers will not be invited to attend this event.

The eggshibition will be held on Thursday 9 April. Students in Years 3-6 who would like to participate are asked to make their diorama at home and bring it to school on Thursday. Students in K-2 participate in a colouring-in competition. Further information will be sent home with K-2.
